


# PROCLAMATION

## Declaration of Disaster



**WHEREAS,** the City of Port Aransas, Texas, on this, 22nd, day of September, 2020, was under the threat of imminent disaster, injury, or loss of life or property, resulting from Tropical Storm Beta, which impacted the coastal and inland areas of the City of Port Aransas and Nueces County, Texas, with flooding or severe damage; and

**WHEREAS,** the Mayor of Port Aransas had determined that extraordinary measures be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property and for other disaster mitigation, response, or recovery; and

**WHEREAS,** the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, as amended, codified as Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code, authorizes the presiding officer of a political subdivision to declare a local state of disaster.

### **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF PORT ARANSAS:**

1. That the local state of disaster declared on Sept. 19<sup>th</sup> by the City of Port Aransas pursuant to §418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code, is now ended.
2. Pursuant to §418.018(c) of the Government Code, this declaration shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.
3. That all Port Aransas beaches be re-opened.
4. That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.

It is hereby **ORDERED**, this the *22nd* day of *September, 2020*.
